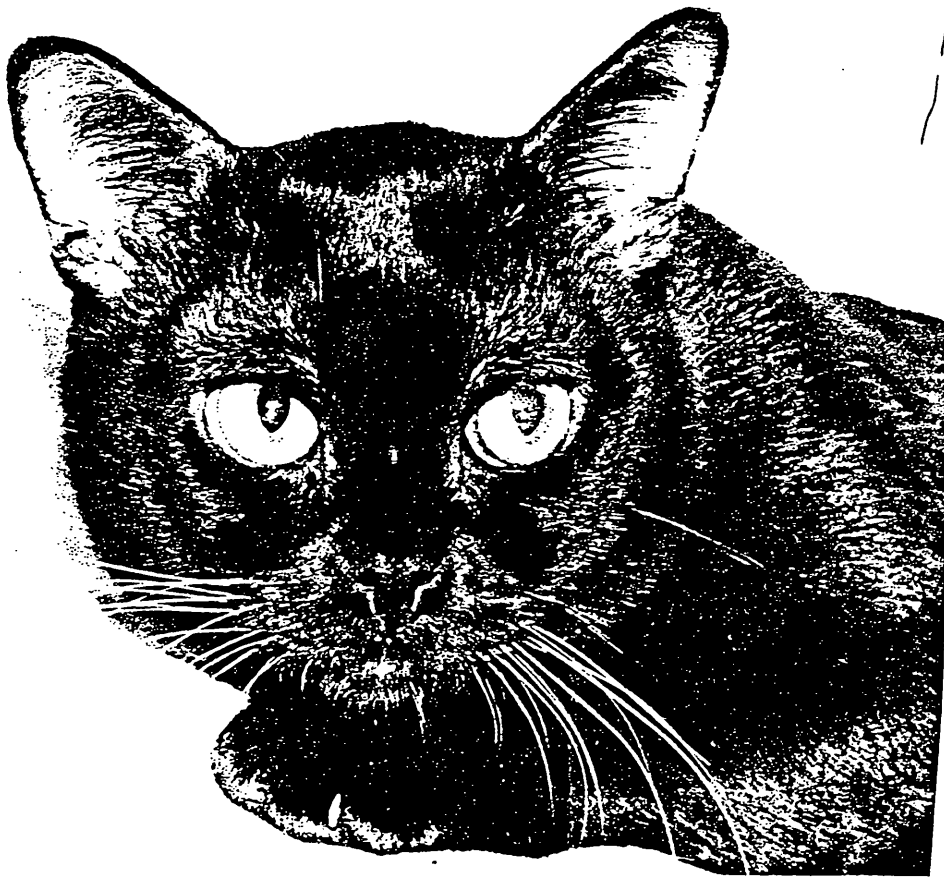

DM AWARDS IN THE BURMESE BREED

CFA issues Distinguished Merit (DM) Awards to Sires that have produced at least 15 grand champion offspring and Dams that have produced at least five.

In the Burmese Breed, there are at least 1 sire and 3 dams that have the honor or DM. The sire Gr. Ch. Good Fortune Fortunatas has sired 30 grand champion offspring to our knowledge--unparalleled in ANY breed!! He is admired by many for his ability to produce such lovely kits; his "prepotency" is quite remarkable. He is owned by Evelyn Chapman, of Annapolis, MD.

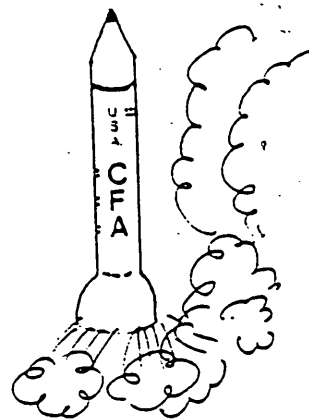

BURMESE BREEDERS' CORNER

KASHMIRIAN CATTERY

I do not believe Kashmirian Cattery would qualify under the definition of a cattery. It would certainly qualify as a retirement home. My oldest cat and first purebred, a siamese name Sesame, died the middle of October at 20-1/2 years old. My breeding cattery consists of 4 cats: 2 studs, one standard and one extreme; and 2 queens, one standard and one extreme. Each queen is bred once a year. I started with Burmese in 1971 but raised Himalayans for several years before that.

I prefer to work with a small number of cats and lavish them with attention, which is undoubtedly as much to my benefit as theirs. None of my cats are ever caged. I love the free spirit of the Burmese and feel their physical and mental health benefits from an open family situation. Yes, we do occasionally have a scrap, but my very large neutered Himalayan, Sebastian, the lord of the realm, a gentle giant with the soul of a pacifist, is the peacekeeper. He sees to it that the combatants do no damage except to their egos. I do have one cage for visiting queens. The 2 males are confined but are as much a part of the family as I can make them. They each have a 12 x 15 ft. bedroom converted for their use. Their rooms are side-by-side at the top of the stairs. They will tolerate each other's presence and scent and chatter to each other like a couple of old wash women, but they will not tolerate the sight of each other. Each room has a heavy wire door and 2 large windows with reinforced screens for summer sun bathing. Both males are sprayers, but confine most of their spraying to Pampers clipped to the wall.

Shandu, also known as Old Grandad, is the "standard" male. He carries the best of the old midwest lines--tight, flat, barless coat, good nose break, large wide-set gold eyes, good dome and ear set. He is the last known breeding son of Temujin-Tu, a standard bearer found somewhere in almost all of our old pedigrees. Shandu has the one family television set in the house in his room so he logs his lap time while we watch a few shows. My moderate size collection of art glass and cat figurines is on one wall. He shares his sunny windows with 4 blooming bougainvillea plants.

Lord Lovatt is my extreme male. He has the one other cage that I own in this room. It has my 25 or so orchid plants in it. He doesn't usually bother the plants, but occasionally, in a fit of pique, he will yank one out of its pot and scatter the potting mix all over the room. Hence, the orchids are caged. One wall in his room has my collection of framed cat pictures which range from good art to pop art. My sewing machine is also in his room and, since I do quite a bit of sewing, he and I have our own sewing circle and gossip session. Many of you will remember what a talker he is. All items are thoroughly inspected by his lordship before being put to their appropriate use.

The girls run loose and are like all busy little Burmese girls. They like music and classical orchestral music at concert-hall pitch and the hi-fi will draw them from anywhere. Carousel, the extreme female, sits on top of one of the speakers and Biddy McGee, the standard female, manages to find the spot of maximum stereo sound.

All cats have access to several varieties of dry food at all times and I feed canned meat twice a day. Of course, they often get treats ranging from roast turkey to cantaloupe, depending on what we have that they like. My husband always shares his breakfast and dinner with his lap full of interested fur people. I do not feed extra nutrients as a general rule, because I

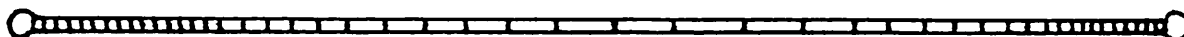
strongly believe (and many animal nutritionists agree) that many problems, both physical and emotional, are created by over-dosing vitamins and minerals. All of my cats are very good eaters and our health problems have been limited to Fall sneezes when all vegetation ripens and the leaves start to fall.

I attend all kitten births. There is always one little one who needs help. Each kitten is weighed every day and records kept of weight and progress. The first time a kitten doesn't gain over a 24 hour period, I start appropriate feedings. Here again, some little one just needs a bit extra. Also, one of my queens is slow to come into milk so it is necessary to see that that kittens get enough nourishment for the first few days. All babies are handled and cooed-at several times a day. It always amazes me how quick their response is. I used to wean onto several types of baby food (human) and mushy mixes. However, for the last several years, as long as the queen has plenty of milk, I just let her wean them onto fork-mashed canned cat food with vitamins added. This is the one time I do feed extra vitamins. Their systems seem to adjust to this weaning process very easily with no stomach upsets. They are fed 5 times a day, gradually fitting into the house routine of 2 feedings/day.

I find in my family line of Burmese that the show quality females are apparent at birth but that the males will be several months old before they show their true potential. It, therefore, has been a help to study pedigrees to know where the successful cats have orginated in the past. A breeder has to develop an artist's eye for balance and harmony, and a wizard's vision for potential. Incredible patience is a pre-requisite!

I have campaigned 3 cats, one in premiership, one in kitten class, and one in championship. Both of my recently campaigned cats, Lord Lovatt and Katie Scarlett, are big eaters so keeping good solid weight on them was never any problem. Show grooming was equally simple--bath once a week and a continued check for those few white hairs.

I'm sure I would campaign again if I had a cat I felt was, according to our breed standard, worthy of the chance. The people I met, the traveling and the general experience were all a pleasure. The only 2 campaign rules I set for myself were to not take it so seriously that I could not loose with some degree of grace, and to be able to say, when it was all over and done with, that I had never intentionally hurt anyone--including my beloved cat. After all, we do all realize our primary interests and intentions are to improve our breed and have happy and healthy cats.
